

Tire Disposal Agreement

Tire Agent Corp, a Delaware Corporation (the "Wholesaler"), and _____
_____ (the "Retailer") have agreed for Retailer to purchase products from Wholesaler
and resell those products to end consumers.

Whereas: Retailer is aware that in each state Retailer sells tires directly to end consumer,
Retailer must charge a fee or tax referred to as Waste Tire Disposal Fees, Tire Excise Tax, or State
Tire Fees depending on the particular state herein collectively referred to as ("Tire Disposal Tax) that
will be retained and paid to the proper local state governing authority when legally applicable.

Whereas: Wholesaler is aware that the responsibility to collect and remit Tire Disposal Tax is
that of Retailers and not of Wholesaler.

Therefore: Based on mutual covenants and consideration Wholesaler and Retailer desire to
memorialize the responsibility in which Tire Disposal Taxes will be paid by Retailer and agree as
follows:

1. Retailer is responsible for paying any and all state-required taxes or fees for any and all states
in which Retailer sells tires to end consumers unless the sale is exempt according to state law. Further,
Retailer is responsible for knowing what those taxes and fees are, charging them at the time of sale, and
remitting them in a timely fashion to the governing body of that particular state when applicable.
2. At no time will the Wholesaler be responsible for paying any Tire Disposal Taxes or any other
taxes on Retailer's behalf. Further, Retailer is also solely responsible for paying Tire Disposal Taxes if it
charges them to customers but does not remit them to the state governing body or remits taxes to the
incorrect state governing body.
3. Further, Retailer will be responsible for communicating with all state governing authorities,
handling any issues regarding unpaid Tire Disposal Taxes, and defending Wholesaler if the state governing
body attempts to charge Wholesaler for the Tire Disposal Taxes on the sale of tires Retailer resold to end
consumers.
4. Attached in "Exhibit A" is a current list of some states and their respective tire disposal fees
and taxes. This Exhibit is only meant for guidance purposes and can change from time to time. It is
Retailer's responsibility to register with the correct governing body and remit the proper amount at that time
to the state governing body when it is due.
